

Bart Baker

A Biographical Sketch



Bart Baker is vice president of the Planning, Operations and Infrastructure Department for the Greenspoint District. The District was created by the State Legislature in 1991, at the request of commercial property owners and is funded through their assessments to provide services and improvements to ensure Greenspoint's growth and prosperity.

Baker is responsible for project management and inter-governmental coordination in the areas of urban design, parks and trails, transportation systems, long-range planning and development initiatives. He also manages several service contracts related to the operation and maintenance of Greenspoint parks, landscaping and the *Clean and Green* program.

During his employment at the District, Baker created and developed the *Greenspoint Parks, Recreation and Open Space Plan*, and serves as chairman of the Greens Bayou Task Force and the Greens Bayou Corridor Coalition North Reach Advisory Committee. He partners with the Texas Department of Transportation in the implementation of several landscaping projects, and advocates for transportation initiatives and projects through involvement in the North Corridor Coalition and the North Houston Association Transportation Committee. He also serves as chair of the Houston Intercontinental Chamber of Commerce Government and Transportation Committee and chair of the Alliance of North Houston Chambers of Commerce.

Before joining the District, Baker worked for the City of Beaumont, serving as a city planner and then senior planner for the city's Planning Division of the Economic Development Department. His responsibilities included development of Neighborhood Plans and updates to the City of Beaumont Comprehensive Plan.

Baker received his Master of Urban Planning and his bachelor's in Environmental Design from Texas A&M University.
